10 YEARS IN THE COMMUNITY



Today, Droitwich Spa foodbank provides emergency food and support for those in need in our community. But the formation of the foodbank found its beginnings in late 2012 when the organisation, Churches Together in Droitwich, noted that there were significant numbers of people struggling to afford food in the face of a cost of living crisis. Led by the Methodist Church Minister, a team of hard working volunteers worked over an 18 month period to raise the funds necessary to launch the first incarnation of Droitwich Spa Foodbank at The Old Library on the 14th July 2014. Established as part of the Trussell Trust the foodbank was able to utilise the knowledge and experience on offer to best help those people needing support in the town.
